"I can do all this through him who gives me strength." – Philippians 4:13

hat verse is my favorite Bible passage, because I know Jesus can take everything bad that's happened in my life and turn it into good," says Jerome, a 47-year-old guest at Kokomo Rescue Mission. "Jesus Christ is the only one who can transform my life."

Jerome has endured a lifetime of hardship. For 11 years as a child, the destructive abuse he suffered from his stepfather left him with severe mental illness, and he's been in and out of jails and psychiatric units throughout his adult life. He's been on several psychotropic drugs to control his illness, but he says the side effects were worse than the illness. "There were times I thought I was going to die," he says. "For the past 15 years, I've been on

Prolixin, which is supposed to help manage paranoia and other schizophrenic symptoms. But for me, it just bypassed all my sense of reality."

He's rarely worked because he's been on disability since the age of 25. Loneliness has haunted him his entire life. "But I've always had a good friend in Jesus," he says. "I know that. God has always been there looking after me through other people."

After his latest release from jail six weeks ago, Jerome had nowhere to go. He wanted to start over somewhere safe, so he came to Kokomo Rescue Mission, where he hopes he can learn to "stand on my own two feet and take responsibility

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for my life, to be independent," without drugs, through the healing power of Jesus Christ.

"I believe Jesus can set me free from this slavery to drugs and mental illness," he says. "Here I'm surrounded by people who love God and who are holding me accountable. I have a spiritual family that is supporting me. I feel better about myself today than I ever have.

"Thank you for helping me grow closer to God, and helping me learn a new way of life and how to live the way Christ wants me to live."

Getting Off the Roller Coaster

ddiction is a powerful thing. I'm not talking only about drugs. That wasn't my most destructive addiction. The worst addiction in my life was to a man. My husband.

I don't know why. Maybe it's because when I was 7, my mother suddenly decided she didn't want to be a mom anymore, handed me over to my dad, and left. My dad loved me, and I was a total daddy's girl. But when my mom abandoned me, I feared being abandoned again and feared being alone for the rest of my life.

When I met my husband, I was 20. And outside of my father, he was the first true love of my life. Unfortunately, he was also a meth addict. So I became one, too. Meth

was the price I paid to keep him close. It turned into a 13-year roller-coaster ride. Sometimes we'd get sober, live a normal life, and raise our three kids. But then he'd go back to meth, hook me into it again, the physical and emotional abuse would come back, and life would spiral out of control.

New Hope for a Better Future

In May 2017, however, I knew this isn't how God wanted me to live. My kids didn't deserve this, and I didn't deserve it. And I knew I had to come to Open Arms with my kids so we could get off the roller coaster.

Open Arms forced me to dig into my past to understand why I did the things I did. They encouraged me, they taught me boundaries, and they gave me, through the power of God and His grace, the strength to change. Today, a year later, my entire life has been transformed.

When I look in a mirror today, I am not Marcie the addict. I am Marcie, strong and beautiful.

Thank you for giving me and my kids hope and the chance for a better life. You gave me the strength to keep going. My kids saw a lot of cruelty, pain, and meanness. But because people like you care, they now see the love that's possible.

Every year, we partner with Grace United Methodist church and people like you to make Thanksgiving special for hundreds of people in our community. We are expecting to serve 600 delicious, traditional Thanksgiving meals at our Great Thanksgiving Banquet this year. On Thanksgiving Day at Grace United Methodist Church, we will serve dinner from 11:30 am – 1:00 pm.

Change in our Meal Amount

Each day, the Mission serves an average of 335-350 meals to our residential program and dining room guests. We all know the price of basic food items like bread, milk, and eggs steadily rise every year and so have our costs to provide those meals.

Although much of our food is donated, we must also stretch our resources to cover other costs to provide well-balanced meals. For nearly ten years, we have been operating at an average cost of \$2.05 per meal. Beginning October 1, there will be a modest increase to our meal donation amount. Your \$2.17 gift combined with donated food will provide a complete meal.


