I'm Not a Mistake

ll my life, I felt like I was a mistake and that I shouldn't be here. I never saw any purpose for my life.

My earliest memories are being sick all the time with allergies. I was allergic to everything and I suffered constantly with swollen eyes, itchy nose, nonstop sneezing, and I couldn't breathe. I was almost never allowed outside, and I was mostly confined to my room. I rarely made it through a day of school.

I know my family loved me. They couldn't help that I was sick. But I grew up almost entirely alone. So, I always felt abandoned. The emotional pain was so great, I started cutting myself because I felt like I deserved to be punished.

As I grew older, my physical health improved. My emotional health didn't. I rarely had close friends because I always thought they would leave me. Then, as a young adult, I was raped. After that, I lived in constant terror of going outside. I tried to commit suicide several times, and I often ended up in psych wards. After the last time, in 2017, I came to Open Arms.

Growing up, my family never really talked about God. Now I know it was God who brought me here. To me, this place is a miracle. I have never felt love like this before. People who don't know me pray for me all hours of the night. They've showed me who I truly am—not a woman

who deserves to be punished, but a woman worthy of love. They turned all my darkness into light. It's strange to say, but I'm truly happy.

As a donor, you'll never understand the impact you had on me. All I can say is, I never saw a purpose for my life before. But thanks to you, I do now. God has shown me that He can use everything I've been through—the abandonment, the rape, the suicide attempts, the depression, everything—to help other people see that He can get them through everything. May God bless you.

Your Support Really Is True Love in Action



always knew Jesus could save someone's soul. He saved mine a long time ago. But could He save my family? Family has always been important to me. I was a total mama's boy as a child. My dad was stern, but he loved me. I grew up with five siblings, and we've always been close. It was the kind of family I always hoped to have myself one day.

Unfortunately, it didn't work out that way. I met my wife about 17 years ago. We had two kids, one born in 2003 and the other in 2006. But my wife and I struggled with all kinds of emotional issues. If it weren't for the kids, I probably would have walked away. But there was no way I was going to do that. I'm a dad and I love my kids. I was determined to never give up, no matter how bad we struggled.

My frustration kept mounting, though. I started spending more and more time away, and it was damaging our kids—especially my son. I just didn't know what to do or how to handle it, and 13 years of frustration finally got to me. I made some really bad choices, acted out, and went to prison for six years. I deserved it and I paid the price.

When I left prison, I came straight to the Kokomo Rescue Mission. I needed to learn how to deal with my frustrations and struggles better. I needed to let God change me.

God did all that and more. I reconnected with Jesus Christ more deeply than ever before. Then, the emotional and spiritual support I received here helped me grow into a better man, a better father, and even a better husband. Yes, a better husband. While I was in prison, Jesus transformed my wife's life, too. We both recognized our mistakes and we got connected to a new faith community. We've reconciled and our family has been resurrected.
