

# The Man in the Mirror -BY STEVE

here was a time when I thought I had everything. I was married to my best friend. I had a good job, making good money. I had a beautiful home, with a lovely yard. My life seemed set, everything moving in the right direction. I could look at myself in the mirror and like what I saw.

Then there was another time, not long ago, when it was all gone. A time when I looked at myself in the mirror and didn't see Steve anymore. All I saw was shame.

It didn't happen overnight, but I know exactly where it started. I did the worst thing I could do: I had an affair and hurt the one person I loved more than anyone—my wife. I never thought I could do something so awful, but I did. We divorced in 2007, and I just couldn't live with myself. So, I started drinking. A lot.

That's when everything snowballed out of control. I started falling deeper and deeper into depression—and the more depressed I got, the more I drank. It got so bad, I quit my job so I could drink 24/7. I drank so much that, last year, a nurse told me if I kept it up, I'd be dead in 90 days.

I had to decide whether I was going to live or die. I chose life and came to the Kokomo Rescue Mission. Everything started to change for me when they gave me a job working the night desk here. Suddenly, I had the chance to minister to guys coming to the Mission seeking help. I saw how God could use me to make a difference in people's lives. And before long, I could hear God saying, "Steve, this is who you are." Hearing

## I'm Here for God

hen I first came to Open Arms, I was homeless and needed help. Thanks to you, I found the help I needed here. But there's more—I also found a mission.

I've experienced a lot of pain and grief in my life. I've been married and divorced twice. I've been beaten. I've endured the trauma of discovering my kids were molested. I have a daughter with mental challenges. I have a son who tried to commit suicide. And I have another son who was murdered.

I experienced so much trauma in Kokomo, I moved to Florida, where my life got better—until 2018. It was a perfect storm, figuratively and literally. First, almost overnight, health issues left me unable to work. Then, my brother got seriously ill, so I moved back to Kokomo to take care of him. While I was here, Hurricane Michael destroyed my home in Florida. And right after that, my brother's landlord evicted me because of rental policies.

Suddenly, I was homeless. But what a blessing, because God led me straight to Open Arms. When I first got here, I felt lost and alone. It didn't last long. Open Arms is an amazing community of women who love God and love one another. We all have different stories and different backgrounds, but we're all in the same boat.

As God used these women to help me get my life back together, I felt my heart increasingly going out to them. Like me, they've been through so much. Then, I realized I had something to give back to them, to *invest* in them. So, I started teaching them to sew, to cook, and to bake cakes—my specialty!

I truly believe God called me to Open Arms, where He has redeemed my homelessness and life and used me to make a difference in these women's lives. I know I won't be here forever, but as long as God has me here, I'm here for God and these women.

As a donor, you not only provided me with food, shelter, and clothing—you gave me a mission. Thank you.
