

rederick says he grew up in a "dog-eat-dog" world. He describes his youth as "running the streets, selling drugs and womanizing on the mean streets of South Chicago."

Though he eventually married and started a family, it didn't change his lifestyle. That dangerous drug-fueled road finally caught up to him when he was sentenced to 48 years in prison for dealing cocaine.

Frederick says he felt great shame for what he had done to his family. He was released after serving 12 years of his sentence. As part of his release, he agreed to spend a year at the Kokomo Rescue Mission, which he says was a godsend.

"The Mission provides a place to live, a place to grow, a place to learn, which is needed in society all over the country, really," he says. "Too many times, the prison system just lets you go with no help at all, and you're stuck with nowhere to turn." Frederick considers himself one of the few lucky ones.

He says the Mission's services, like financial classes, help with important aspects of a prisoner's

reentry into society. And he says the Mission is a center for spiritual growth, which he believes is the most important aspect.

Frederick is determined to rebuild a life with his family. He says he is so grateful for the Mission, its dedicated staff and the donors who support the work here. Fred has been reunited with his family, is doing well and now has a stable job as a courier driver.




